The questionnaire consists of 37 simple questions that a parent is asked to then rate as either not a problem, moderately a problem, or a severe problem. Anything rated as a severe problem should prompt an assessment by a professional. The questionnaire takes 10 minutes to complete and is a useful snapshot of how parents view their situation.
