Paper folding. Students explore folding paper shapes into equal parts and labelling the parts with written fractions. Select the shapes to be used according to the type of fraction being studied. Rectangles and thin strips are suitable for all fractions. Circles and triangles are less versatile.

Here is a simple way you can fold a piece of paper into any fraction you would like – exactly – no guessing or fiddling needed! Folding a third. To start, take a square piece of paper and mark half way along top side with a small crease. Now fold the bottom left corner to meet this halfway mark and create the paper.

Provide each student with a piece of rectangular paper. Fold the paper in half. After you have folded the paper in half, instruct students to do the same. Explain that a fraction is a part of a whole. You have divided a whole piece of paper into two equal parts. Instruct students to color one of the two equal parts.

Fold the second paper in half, and cut on the folded line. Label each of these halves "1/2." Fold your third paper into thirds, cut along the folded lines, and label each third "1/3."

The fold line is traced with a crayon or colored pencil, and each part is marked with fraction $\frac{1}{2}$. Because the Common Core Math Practices require students to attend to precision, the folding of the fraction strips accurately is very important especially as each fractional pieces decrease in size. The folding continues with orange for the fourths.

Paper Folding We sequence the use of paper strips after fraction circles for students to extend and reinforce key ideas about unit and partitioning. Students again have to coordinate the meaning of the numerator and denominator with this new model.

To make $\frac{1}{3}$ pieces and $\frac{1}{6}$ pieces, start by folding a paper plate in half and cutting along the fold. Then fold one side of each half over $\frac{1}{3}$ of the way and fold the other side over. Carefully line up the edges, crease the folds, and cut along the folded lines. Label these as $\frac{1}{6}$.

• Hold up the red paper in landscape position. Model folding the paper in half. Leaving the paper folded, hold it against the yellow sheet. Ask students how many reds they would need to cover the yellow sheet.
