Roman Homosexuality: Social Status and Acceptance

Sexuality instead is determined by behavioral mannerisms, whether masculine or passive in both male and female roles. A Roman husband could have sex outside of marriage as long as his partner was considered sexually available, i.e. was a prostitute, a slave, or an infamis such as an actress. He committed adultery (adulterium) only when he had sex with another Roman citizen's wife or unmarried daughter. In contrast, no infidelity was acceptable for a Roman woman and first-time brides were expected to be virgins.
